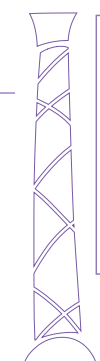

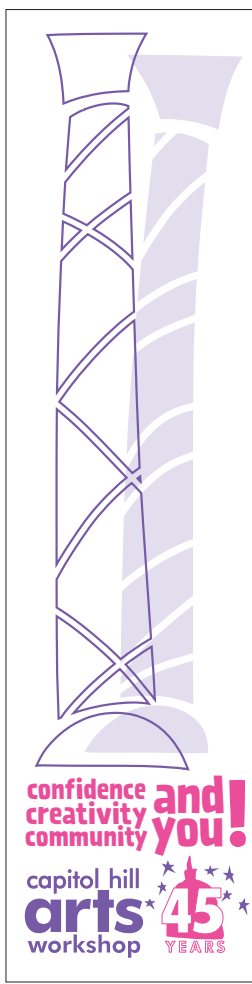
Dear (Salutation),
